

# FROM THE EDITOR

take the time or spend the money to buy the gifts or food they want for their loved ones. There are a few holiday-specific programs that exist solely for the purpose of making the season a bit brighter for those who need it the most.

Learn about our local Toy Drive that has a long history here in town and continues to bring joy to hundreds of children each year. More recently, Uxbridge resident Lori Venhola started a new program to provide the opportunity for locals to Adopt a Senior which means that over 400 residents of nursing and retirement homes receive a basket of locally purchased items delivered right to their door.

The Salvation Army assists families with the Christmas Hampers they assemble and the Uxbridge Scugog Pet Food Bank, which operates year round, has a Christmas initiative which serves the 'invisible need' to help pets remain with their owners as the cost of necessities continues to rise. In this issue, we not only bring to you the details about each of these initiatives, but we highlight the people who make these programs available - the Holiday Makers of Uxbridge.



In the heart of Uxbridge and Scugog, amidst the challenges brought by the pandemic, one remarkable woman emerged as a beacon of hope for both the furry companions and their owners. Meet Mel Diebel, the compassionate soul behind the local Uxbridge Scugog Pet Food Bank, a vital lifeline for countless pets and their families.

With a heart deeply rooted in rescue work, In a bid to address long-term storage Mel embarked on this noble journey long before the world was gripped by the clutches of COVID-19. When the pandemic struck, she found herself at the front lines, tirelessly assisting various charities, shelters, and rescue organizations. But it was during these challenging times that a new need surfaced - pet owners, facing financial hardships, were unable to provide food for their beloved animals. There had to be another option than just giving their pets away to a shelter. The pleas for help grew louder as people, overwhelmed by the burdens of unemployment, struggled to feed their pets.

From this moment of need, the Uxbridge Scugog Pet Food Bank was born, starting on a modest scale in Uxbridge and Scugog. Initially, Mel parked outside the Uxbridge Town Hall, distributing dog food to anyone who required it. The outreach soon quickly expanded, collaborating with food banks and other community organizations throughout Uxbridge, Scugog and Brock, ensuring that pet owners facing financial struggles could access the support they needed. This initiative became a light in the darkness, helping over 800 pets per month remain in their homes and providing essential supplies to rescues in their time of need.

One of the notable successes of the Pet Food Bank lies in its Christmas initiative. What started with 170 bags in its inaugural year grew to an astounding 400 bags this year. Each bag includes toys, treats, pet food, a Christmas card, coupons and other supplies. The out-pouring of support from the community allowed the initiative to thrive, ensuring that the 'invisible need' was met.

Apart from food distribution, the Pet Food Bank played a pivotal role in sourcing much-needed pet supplies. From harnesses, collars and leashes to pet sweaters and coats to kitty litter and cat/dog toys, these often overlooked items brought immense joy to families and their pets. The outreach didn't stop there - the Pet Food Bank collaborated with local businesses like Trail Capital Pharmacy and Pharmasave Uxbridge (downtown location), enabling direct donations to the Uxbridge Loaves and Fishes Food Bank and facilitating drop-offs for much-needed supplies.

challenges, the Pet Food Bank invested in a shipping container, ensuring the safe storage of food supplies. Their commitment to sustainability was reflected in their fundraising efforts, including community BBQs and online auctions, which not only raised funds but also created a sense of community.

What makes the Pet Food Bank truly special is the collaborative spirit of the community. Individuals and businesses rallied together, exemplifying the spirit of togetherness. From the Uxbridge Helping Hands Facebook Group to 100 Women Who Care Uxbridge to local businesses and notfor-profit organizations, the community stood as one, acknowledging the 'invisible need' and working tirelessly to meet it.








# **Give the gift of Christmas**

The Uxbridge Optimist Fantasy of Lights has become a beloved holiday tradition here in our town. Now in its 16th year, businesses, families, churches and service groups throughout Uxbridge unite to craft enchanting light displays in Elgin Park, transforming it into a wonderland that draws visitors from across the Greater Toronto Area.

From December 2nd to January 6th, between 6 pm and 9:30 pm, including Christmas Eve and Christmas Day, the park is open to all. The event is one of the biggest exhibits of Christmas lights in Canada. The Fantasy of Lights has even been listed on **readersdigest.ca** in their Most Magical Drive-Through Christmas Light Displays Across Canada article.

The event wouldn't be possible without the Wilson Family – Jan, John, Randy and Skye, as well as a few other senior members of the Optimist Club. Guidance for displays is offered by John and Jan while Randy and Skye help provide lighting expertise. What started with just a dozen small displays has continued to grow each year. Last year, the Fantasy of Lights featured an astonishing 97 light displays! Organizers are proud of this growth, emphasizing that while they can only accommodate a certain amount of displays within the park, due to space and electrical output, there's always room

Jan says the event got its roots as a gift to the community. It was an ambitious effort to light up Uxbridge and bring joy to its residents. What motivates these dedicated individuals to continue year after year? According to John, the most rewarding aspect is witnessing the joy in the faces of

Uxbridge community. A Community Effort Set-up for the Fantasy of Lights begins at the end of September in the park but the work continues throughout the year. This includes constructing displays in backvards and garages and the administrative preparations which are always ongoing within the club. The success of the event wouldn't be possible without the support of the entire Uxbridge community. The town provides hydro, as well as barricades and pylons for

the event volunteers. The nearby neighbours bring cheers, warm drinks and treats, as well as maintain a neighbourhood watch on the park. It truly is a collective effort that brings the Fantasy of Lights to life. If you're looking to join in the fun behind the scenes, the Optimist Club is



The Fantasy of Lights is a free event but donations graciously are accepted. The proceeds go towards supporting an array of local youth initiatives. These include accessibility projects, playgrounds, and much more. The Optimist Club of Uxbridge works diligently to ensure that the funds raised make a meaningful difference in the lives of the town's youth. Through their efforts, the club has raised approximately \$300,000 in the past 5 years, all of which was reinvested into the

The event runs nightly for almost the entirety of December and into January. This requires many helping hands - often 8-10 individuals per night. The more the merrier!

Over the years, the team has faced a variety of challenges, from unpredictable weather scholarships, the Uxbridge Youth Centre, to navigating the technical intricacies of lighting displays. Yet, their commitment to the cause has kept it going strong. During the pandemic when many events were scaled back, the Fantasy of Lights became even bigger.

As the event continues to evolve and grow, it has become a staple within the community of Uxbridge. The peak traffic times are typically during weekends and over the holidays, but the organizers assure, though lineups can be long, wait times are typically minimal.

When the pandemic began in 2020, feelings of loneliness, boredom and isolation were common among the community, even more so during the holiday season. This was especially hard for our seniors, many of whom were in retirement or nursing homes.

Unable to have regular visits from their friends and family, the holidays weren't feeling very festive. Uxbridge resident Lori Venhola noticed - and she was determined to bring that magic back, founding the Adopt a Senior program.

The program pairs community members with a participating senior, providing a gift for them to open Christmas morning. A donation covers the cost of a standard gift bag, and from there participants can add other special touches. Growing each year, last year's program brought gifts to 350-400 seniors across town!

# Let's Pack a Gift!

# Discover the Sparkle of the Season WITH RUTLEDGE JEWELLERS' **CHRISTMAS DISPLAY**

On February 1st 2022, it was a dark wintery night but if you drove down Brock Street West past Rutledge Jewellers, it was colourful and bright. The store was outlined in red lights and out front was an arbour consisting of several large pink and red hearts in anticipation of Valentine's Day.

During a time when we were still in the grips of the pandemic and the general outlook was not very uplifting, this large outdoor installation provided a way the day after Remembrance Day. Strands of garland, to bring a little joy to an otherwise dreary time. Passersby could walk up to stand inside the arbour - day or night - and snap a photo with their loved ones.

For Scott Rutledge, owner of Rutledge Jewellers, while the themes may evolve year over year, his commitment to going 'BIG' with his displays remains constant.

Christmas-themed displays were nothing new for Rutledge Jewellers where a transformation always begins lights - and one year there was a train attached to the ceiling - are hung inside of the store while elaborate urns are assembled to greet you as you approach the front door. This portion of the sidewalk extends into the street to accommodate the Rutledge Jewellers' outdoor clock, and Scott saw this as an opportunity to create a larger seasonal display.



It takes a dedicated team working over two days to get the store transformed for Christmas. Every year Scott and his staff begin brainstorming in the spring for the following December. Large custom display pieces are sketched out with local craftspeople and urn designs are prepped with growers at Otter Greenhouses.

New garlands were recently purchased to upgrade the interior decorations and Scott says a Hallmark-movie feeling is central to the theme inside and out. When asked what drives him to create

these elaborate scenes each year, Scott says that it's the special moments he witnesses that make it worthwhile a family snapping a photo together, kids excitedly running up to the larger-thanlife pieces, and the joy of holiday shoppers getting to experience something fun. Instead of just creating a display that people view, he aims to create an environment they can interact with.

In 2021, Rutledge Jewellers became one of the central attractions of The Holiday Trail - a series of weekends organized by Discover Uxbridge (Uxbridge Tourism) to entice shoppers into embracing local businesses during the bustling holiday shopping season. The Holiday Trail returns this December for its third year and businesses up and down Brock Street (including Rutledge Jewellers) will be involved.

Past displays have included a sleigh perfect for family photo ops, oversized presents adorned with giant ribbons, Christmas trees, life size nutcrackers, and

# **Unsung Heroes**

The Uxbridge Toy Drive has faced its fair share of challenges through the years. One of the most significant has been logistical - finding suitable locations for toy storage and distribution. The Town has played a pivotal role in helping overcome this challenge. Pat says, "Finding a good venue to store and sort the toys is key." Andy adds that not only is finding a location a challenge but finding a partner to help

distribute through the year as well. It doesn't just end at Christmas, items that are donated get distributed during important times of the year, whether that's to children in hospitals or kids that need birthday gifts.

Distributing toys in a timely manner before Christmas is critical and each volunteer has their role to play. The Toy Drive has partners within the community ranging from Social Service Groups and Churches that will distribute the toys directly to the families, anonymously. The Toy Drive only distributes to those organizations, of whom handle this process with the utmost respect. Andy's role for example is maintaining the website, the collection of toys and picking up donations from various distribution groups. He's not involved in bringing the donations to families. Each year, since the beginning, Williamson Uxbridge has donated a vehicle for collection.

The program has evolved beyond just toys. The Toy Drive assists not only children but many teenagers as well. Gift cards and cash are also accepted and have become a very important component. Andy says, "The forgotten ages are always teens. The focus gets put on small children when there's so many teenagers that have needs too." Ideal gifts change each year. They are provided with lists from local organizations based on genders, age and their various needs. This is why cash is a good donation - that way organizers can buy the items missing from individualized lists.

# **Getting Involved**

For those who wish to contribute to this remarkable cause, there are several ways you can get involved. You can make donations, either in the form of new, unwrapped toys or cash and gift cards.

Early donations are crucial, ensuring that toys can be distributed well before Christmas. Andy recommends you make any final donations at least 10 days prior.

Sponsors won't receive the names of the family to keep it anonymous, but will get info such as clothing sizes and the children's favourite characters. After all the sponsor purchases are complete, Bev compiles the gifts with toy and food donations to create the hampers. 




